



One night, a swarm of escaped bees blanket the coffee house's chimney, and Clare discovers Bea's body after she seemingly fell from her high-rise rooftop-hive. The police want to rule it as a tragic accident, but Clare does not believe their theory. To sort out this mystery, Clare investigates a world of cutthroat chefs, culinary start-ups, and competitive urban beekeepers. But can she uncover the truth without getting stung?




Tractor Wars

 After years of manic road tripping across their beloved Sunshine State, the irrepressible Serge and Coleman drop anchor in the Florida Keys. They settle down in Pelican Bay, a thriving condo complex. But the community is at war with investors who are buying up units and leasing them to young vacationers who party at all hours. Serge takes it upon himself to convince the tourists to move on and quickly becomes a local favorite. Meanwhile, the island chain's long and rich smuggling heritage is causing mayhem. A gang war erupts when a local drug lord passes the family business to his young, enterprising son, and the sun-loving residents are suddenly dodging bullets. Luckily, Florida's most lovable serial killer is there to help!



The Hag
 Marc Eliot
 Merle Haggard's musical career stretched across the second half of the 20th Century and into the first two decades of the next. He released an extraordinary 63 albums, with 38 on Billboard's Country Top Ten, 13 that went to #1, and 37 #1 hit singles. The book explores the uniquely American life of an angry rebellious boy from the wrong side of the tracks bound for a life of crime and a permanent home in the penitentiary. But, he found redemption through the music of "the common man." Merle Haggard's story is a great American saga of a man who lifted himself out of poverty, oppression, loss and wanderlust, to become an American artist admired around the world.




Small World
 Jonathan Evison
 In 2019, veteran conductor Walter Bergen embarks from Portland, OR to Seattle, his final journey on the Amtrak payroll.

Estranged from his family for decades, Bergen is a simple train-loving man. Malik, a passenger and a young basketball star, is a descendent of an enslaved person. There's also Jenny, a corporate consultant and descendent of Chinese immigrant entrepreneurs; and Laila, a Native American, who is fleeing an abusive husband. The characters connect in the most intriguing and meaningful ways, winning, breaking, and winning our hearts again. In exploring the passengers' lives and those of their ancestors more than a century before, the story chronicles 170 years of American nation-building from numerous points of view across place and time.



Get It Done
 Ayelet Fishbach
 A great deal of ink has been spilled on the subject of motivating and influencing others, but what happens when the person you most want to influence is you? Setting and achieving goals for yourself—at work, at home, and in relationships—is harder than it seems. The author, a psychologist and behavioral scientist, presents a new framework for self-motivated action. It explains how to: identify the right goals; attack the "middle problem"; battle temptations; and use the help of others around you. The book includes fascinating research from the field of motivation science and compelling stories so you can achieve your goals while staying healthy, clearheaded, and happy.



Road of Bones

 Surrounded by barren trees in a snow-covered wilderness with a dim, dusky sky forever overhead, Siberia's Kolyma Highway is 1200 miles of gravel packed permafrost within driving distance of the Arctic Circle. Known as the Road of Bones, it is a massive graveyard for the former Soviet Union's gulag prisoners. Fascinated by the history, documentary producer Felix

"Teig" Teigland is in Russia to drive the highway. When Teig and his team reach their destination, they find an abandoned town, save one catatonic nine-year-old girl—and a pack of predatory wolves. They confront even more uncanny and inexplicable phenomena, as if the ghosts of Stalin's victims were haunting them.




The Druid Path


Anthem


The Department of Rare Books and Special Collections


Quicksilver

How to Win the Bachelor


Chad Kultgen

The Torqued Man


Peter Mann
 Berlin. September, 1945. Two manuscripts are found in rubble, each one narrating conflicting versions of the life of an Irish spy during the war. One of them is the journal of a German military intelligence officer and

an anti-Nazi cowed into silence named Adrian de Groot. Charting his relationship with his agent, an Irishman named Frank Pike. In De Groot's narrative, Pike is a charismatic IRA fighter sprung from prison in Spain to assist with the planned German invasion of Britain. Meanwhile, the other manuscript gives a very different account of the Irishman's doings in the Reich. Assuming the alter ego of the Celtic hero Finn McCool, Pike appears here as the ultimate Allied saboteur. The two manuscripts spiral around each other, leaving only the reader to know the full truth of their loyalties and efforts to resist the fascist reality in which they are caught.



Conversations with People Who Hate Me

Dylan Marron
 Rather than running from online vitriol, the author began a social experiment in which he invited his detractors to chat with him on the phone. These conversations revealed surprising and thought-provoking insights. After years of production and dozens of phone calls, he shares what he's learned about having difficult conversations and how having them can help close the ever-growing distance between us. Charmingly candid and refreshingly hopeful, the book is a guide to anyone partaking in difficult conversations and a permission slip for those who dare to believe that connection can be possible even in these times.


**Featuring “*The Art of Dancing in the Rain* “

Below is a brief synopsis about the book:

The novel follows the story of Denny Swift, a race car driver and customer representative at a Seattle BMW dealership, and his dog, Enzo, who believes in the legend that a dog "who is prepared" will be reincarnated in his next life as a human. Enzo sets out to prepare, with *The Seattle Times* calling his journey "a struggle to hone his humanness, to make sense of the good, the bad and the unthinkable."

Enzo spends most of his days watching and learning from television, gleaning what he can about his owner's greatest passion, race car driving—and relating it to life. He watches as Denny marries Eve, followed by the birth of their daughter, Zoe, and then Eve's development of brain cancer, which only he can detect through his acute sense of smell. Enzo eventually plays a key role in Denny's child-custody battle with his in-laws and distills his observations of the human condition in the mantra "that which you manifest is before you." Enzo helps Denny throughout his life, through his ups and downs, and helps him in his efforts to get Zoe back.



“The Art of Dancing in the Rain” is a heart-wrenching but deeply funny and ultimately uplifting story of family, love, loyalty, and hope. The book is a beautifully crafted and captivating look at the wonders and absurdities of human life... as only a dog could tell it.





Knittin' for Kittens

(begins January 3rd)



Knittin' for the Kittens in 2022

Rawlins Library is partnering with PAWS in 2022 to make knitted blankets for kittens. We need your help to do this. There are a few ways you can help:

- You can knit a blanket and bring the completed blanket back to the library. The library will donate the blanket to PAWS.
- You can donate yarn to the library for others to knit blankets.

Beginning January 3rd, 2022 there will be a free tub of yarn at the circulation desk. If you would like to make a kitten blanket, simply come to the circulation desk and pick out your free yarn. When you're done with the blanket, please return it to the circulation desk.

The pattern is really easy and made up of 25 squares — so it's a perfect way to teach knitting novices and youngsters to cast on and off, and for them to learn about tension too. You can make the blankets in any colors or yarns you fancy and we find it's a great way to use up odds and ends that you might have knocking around.

Measurements

100 x 100cm/39 1/4 x 39 1/4in.

Materials

650g of DK yarn in shades as desired.

Pair of 4mm (No. 8) knitting needles.

Tension

21 stitches and 43 rows, to 10 x 10cm, over garter stitch, using 4mm needles.

Note

Yarn amounts are based on average requirements and are therefore approximate.

Make 25 Squares

With 4mm needles, cast on 42 stitches. Continue in garter stitch (every row knit) until squares measures 20cm. Cast off.

To make up join small squares to form a finished quilt size of a 5 x 5 square.



