Proof of residency and a government-issued photo ID are required for all library patrons to obtain a library card.

Juvenile accounts (under the age of 18) can get a library card if they are linked to a parent/guardian.

Proof of residency items include:

- Bank statement
- Homeowner's or renter's insurance policy
- Mortgage statement
- Pay stub
- Phone bill
- Rent receipt or lease
- Tax document
- Utility bill
- Vehicle registration

Proof of photo ID items include:

- Driver's license issued within the United States including U.S. Territories
- . Non-driver's photo ID issued within the United States including U.S. Territories


