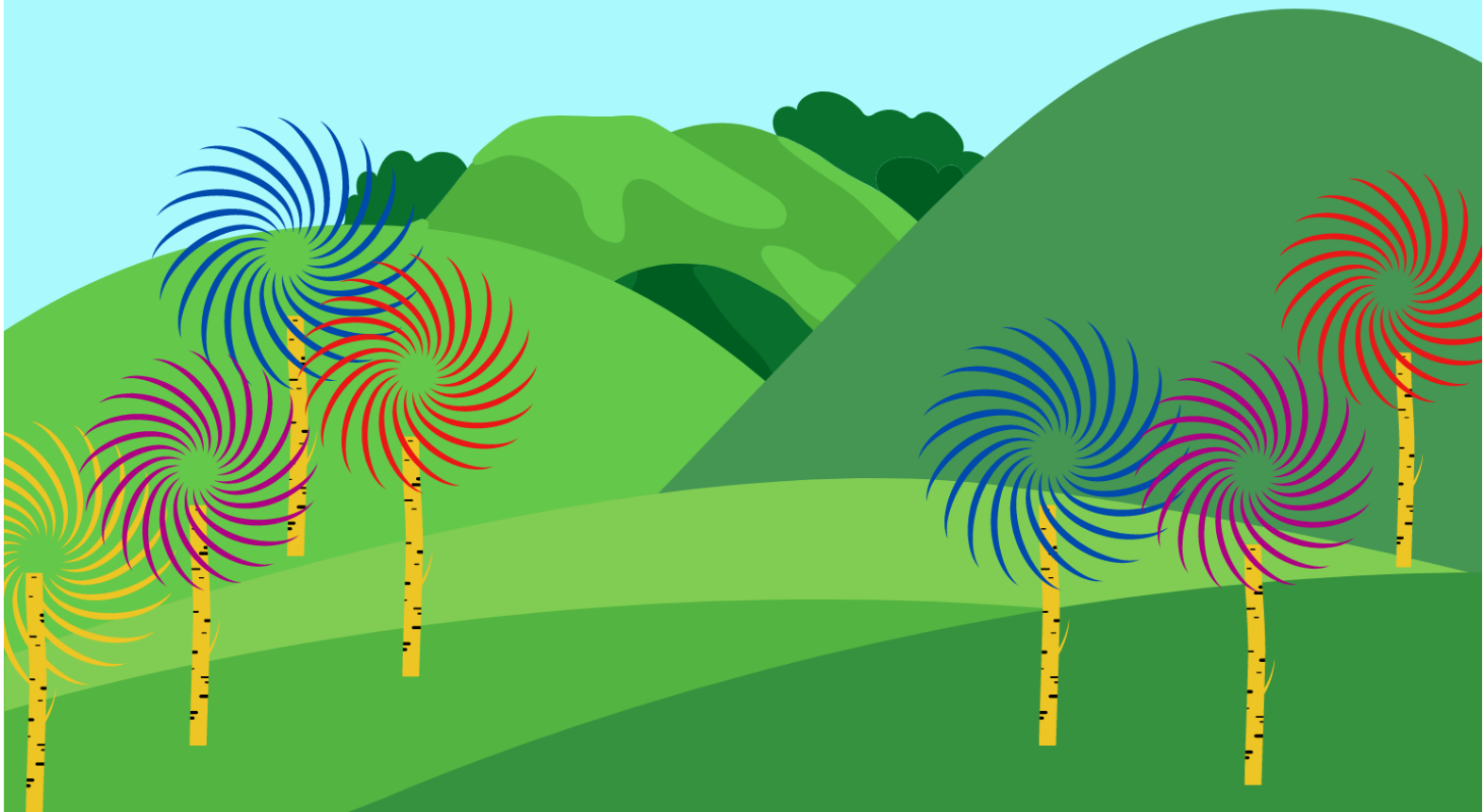

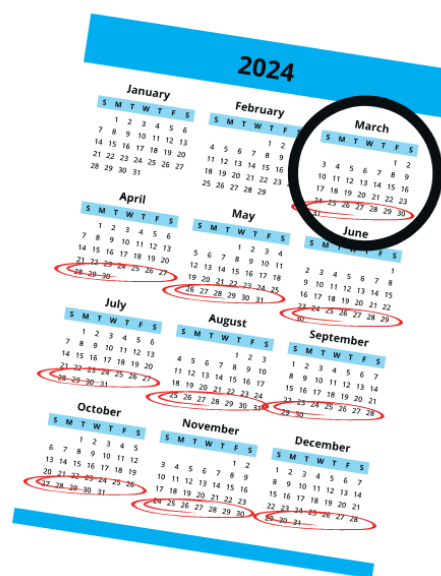


# Patrons Can Enjoy Bonus Borrows Every Month!

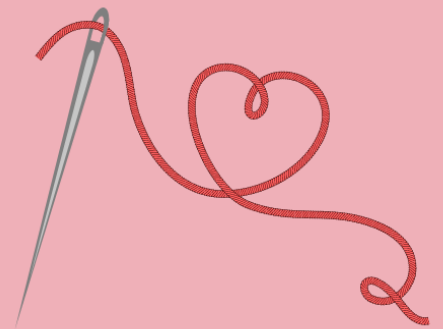

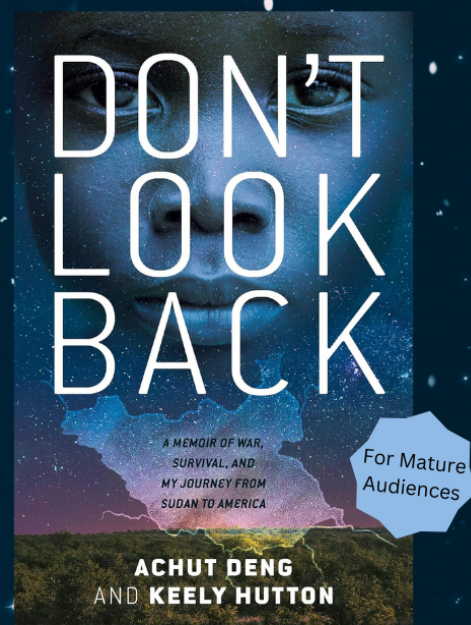
