## What?

Starting the evening of October 31, 2024 Hoopla content will no longer be available to Rawlins Municipal Library patrons.

Patrons do not need to cancel or delete Hoopla access; it's availability will disappear.

Those who are members of another library or library system that offers Hoopla, can access it through that membership.

## Why?

Rawlins Municipal Library began offering Hoopla in January of 2024 as a pilot program to provide streaming music and movies. Since starting Hoopla, the costs associated with the service have risen steadily.

Although it is free for patrons to use, Rawlins Library gets charged for every item a patron checks out. We believe the pricing model and cost of Hoopla make it unsustainable; the library will reallocate our resources to other digital content.

## Now what?

While patrons will no longer be able to access Hoopla, they will still be able to access content from OverDrive/Libby.

## Unattended Children's Policy

Kids need to be picked up by closing time. The library is open 9 AM to 8 PM Monday through Thursday, 9 AM to 5 PM on Fridays and Saturday, and 12 PM to 5 PM on Sundays.

## How Can I Get a Library Card?

Proof of residency and a government-issued photo ID are required for all library patrons to obtain a library card.

Juvenile accounts (under age 18) can get a library card if they are linked to a parent/guardian.

## Proof of residency items include:

- · A piece of cancelled mail
- Bank statement
- Homeowner's or renter's insurance policy
- Mortgage statement
- Pay stub
- Phone bill
- · Rent receipt or lease
- Tax document
- Utility bill
- Vehicle registration

## Proof of photo ID items include:

- Driver's license issued within the United States including U.S. Territories
- Non-driver's photo ID issued within the United States including U.S. Territories
- U.S. passport
- U.S. military ID
- Tribal ID

## Kids ages 17 and under that wish to use the internet...

Kids ages 17 and younger that wish to use the internet will need to have a library card in good standing and have a computer form signed by the parent or legal guardian.

There is a three hour time limit, per patron, per day.






