## Unattended Children's Policy

Kids need to be picked up by closing time. The library is open 9 AM to 8 PM Monday through Thursday, 9 AM to 5 PM on Fridays and Saturday, and 12 PM to 5 PM on Sundays.

# How Can I Get a Library Card?

Proof of residency and a government-issued photo ID are required for all library patrons to obtain a library card.

Juvenile accounts (under age 18) can get a library card if they are linked to a parent/guardian.

## Proof of residency items include:

- · A piece of cancelled mail
- Bank statement
- Homeowner's or renter's insurance policy
- Mortgage statement
- · Pay stub
- Phone bill
- · Rent receipt or lease
- Tax document
- Utility bill
- Vehicle registration

# Proof of photo ID items include:

- Driver's license issued within the United States including U.S. Territories
- Non-driver's photo ID issued within the United States including U.S. Territories
- U.S. passport
- U.S. military ID
- Tribal ID

# Kids ages 17 and under that wish to use the internet...

Kids ages 17 and younger that wish to use the internet will need to have a library card in good standing and have a computer form signed by the parent or legal guardian.

There is a three hour time limit, per patron, per day.




# SUPER SENIOR DAY

CHECK OUT THE BOOK AT RAWLINS LIBRARY. For years, Nigel Slater has kept notebooks of curiosities and wonderings, penned while at his kitchen table, soaked in a fisherman's hut in Reykjavik, sitting calmly in a moss garden in Japan or sheltering from a blizzard in a Vienna Konditorei.

These are the small moments, events and happenings that gave pleasure before they disappeared. Miso soup for breakfast, packing a suitcase for a trip and watching a butterfly settle on a carpet, hiding in plain sight. He gives short stories of feasts such as a mango eaten in monsoon rain or a dish of restorative macaroni cheese and homes in on the scent of freshly picked sweet peas and the sound of water breathing at night in Japan.

This funny and sharply observed collection of the good bits of life, often things that pass many of us by, is utter joy from beginning to end.
